








### MEET THE MISSIONARIES

Don and Margie's objective was to start building houses for the village widows and very poor in Southern India. They have grown to become a ministry helping widows and the marginalized in India and beyond - they have expanded to multiple countries and continents.

The Soulieres manage New Beginnings maternity home in Puyallup, overseeing the care of women who have chosen life over abortion.



### Shan & Lindsey Mahawon, Founders of Victory Church

Shan and Lindsey planted and pastor Victory Church in Chaing Mai, Thailand. Their ministry reaches into multiple other nations as well.







### David & Paula Mahawon, Founders of Trumpets of Christ

David and Paula have been in ministry for more than 38 years. They founded Trumpets of Christ International in 1992. TCI was to be used as a means of reaching the nations for Christ. They also oversee Faith Village Children's Home.

### Spencer & Patti Jeffries and children, Della, Idah, and Silas.

Patti and Spencer received the call to missions over 20 years ago. They have faithfully served and patiently awaited the right time to launch into their calling. May 2024 marks the one-year anniversary of the Jefferies in Uganda! They continue to direct the WOMF Mission House in Seguku.

### Children's Home Faith Village

THATON, THAILAND

2023-24 Has been an extremely exciting and challenging year! A year that we have had to completely rely on the guidance of the Holy Spirit and faith. As I (Paula) was driving though our mango orchard in 2019 just as Covid began, the Lord spoke to me and said, Psalms 127:1 "Unless the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain who build it." As I looked at the church puzzled, I said, "But Lord, I thought you were building the house." The Lord was quiet, and it wasn't until 2023 that He began to give us instruction to rebuild, revamp, and restructure both Faith Village Children's Home and Victory Church Thaton. This year has been a whirlwind of cleaning, repairing, and building the place physically and spiritually to get ready for growth. The teens were a great help to David while he was repairing the roof on the church, and they love learning to farm because they get the opportunity to learn how to drive a tractor! They learn many job skills here at Faith Village, which helps them find jobs when they leave here.

At the same time, as the Lord leads, we have been restructuring each department of the church. Most of our Worship team grew up and moved to the city for school. So, we have quickly been training new worship leaders in playing musical instruments, singing, and most of all, how to flow under the anointing of the Holy Spirit and how to hear God's voice. Asaph's Journal School of Worship has been a tremendous blessing in helping with this.

We hold weekly foundational teachings on Wednesday evenings. The people love it. We are seeing such a hunger for Jesus and growth rising in them. The teens have been going through an online book club, studying *The Purpose Driven Man* and *Going All In*. Around 20 people have come to know Jesus as their Savior this year! Praise God! We have also held weekly outreaches into the local villages, sharing gifts, the Word of God, and Jesus to all who will listen.

We have had two Bible camps this year for the teens and children, made two trips to Swenson's Ice Cream Parlor, taken the children hiking and camping, and one trip for Korean Bing Su.

In April, the children had their summer break and took a fun trip to the beach for three days. Most of them had never seen the ocean and approached it with wide eyes and amazement!

December brought Christmas shopping, Christmas dramas, two cultural dinners and traditional dance. It was great fun for all, the teens all got guitars, the small boys received remote control cars, and the little girls were surprised with Barbie dolls and games. Thank you to New Horizon for partnering with us in all we do.

### VICTORY CHURCH

CHAING MAI

n the last year, Victory Church has seen growth that exceeded our expectations!
At the start of 2023, there were about 100 adults and 20 kids attending church each Sunday.

By May 2023, it grew to 180 adults and 30 kids. Since last year, we have had six baptisms of new believers. The kids' program exceeded its space and expanded into the hallway.



At the same time, we continued to reach out to youth by visiting the campus each week to pray and play sports with students. We ran the Alpha Youth program, and saw youth impacted, grow deeper in faith, and have significant encounters with the Holy Spirit. From that program we began discipling and training key young leaders in our church, all in their lower 20s.

We hired three part-time staff and two interns, all 30 years and younger, to manage areas like multimedia, translation, secretary work, and music.

Right now, we have three current cell groups and plan to launch four more this year. Three young adults in our cell and Alpha groups are ready to start their own groups with middle school and high schoolers.

As the months went by in 2023, the kids program continued to grow, and it became increasingly necessary that we expand to a new space to accommodate the kids and growing adult service.

In November 2023, we launched an initiative to move our church to the third floor, and take over the entire floor, almost tripling our usable space! The main need was for the kids' program, which was bursting at the seams.

In December of 2023, we had enough funds to begin construction. The kids' wing was completed in January 2024, and we expanded to three rooms for three age groups of Sunday school on Sunday. We reached 100% of our construction funding goal in January, and officially completed and moved down to the third-floor sanctuary on February 4, 2024. That Sunday we had 40 kids and over 200 adults. What was most special to us is the day before the move, around 20 volunteers dedicated their entire day to clean and set-up, some staying untill 10pm to get things ready. Our team and church body are full of joy, expectation, and thankfulness for how God has provided.

As we look towards 2024, we sense the need to grow deeper roots with our team and key leaders. The church is growing rapidly, and to support that growth, we need to have confident, godly, faithfilled people who can stand beside us and support the work He's given us! God led Shan to start a leadership school, in which key leaders in the church learn theology and leadership skills.

Pray for our young people as God leads us to pour into them in different ways this year. Some of the things we have planned are Alpha pre-marriage classes, leadership school, starting cell groups, and intentional, day-to-day discipleship. Pray for us as we change systems in the church to support the growth. Pray for us to keep vision and focus as we lead, and to lead well!

Something that we feel sure of is that God has called us to equip local leaders to reach their own for Christ. That was our mission statement when we first left for the field together in 2014, and we see how God has faithfully kept us pursuing that mission. This year marks 10 years on the field in Thailand together. God is faithful, and we are grateful for the faithful partners and friends who have stood by us and supported us!

We are one year into our family's calling to work with women who have chosen *life* for their unplanned pregnancies, and we are amazed at all God is doing.

In the past year, we have been house parents to 15 pregnant women and have welcomed five "grand babies". Steph has been mentoring and teaching birth and newborn classes, while Jon has been mentoring fathers-to-be as well as helping residents learn valuable life skills in finance and budgeting. We have witnessed how the Gospel and a family environment can transform hopeless, insecure women to become joyful, Jesus-following mommas!

One resident who recently graduated to independent living said, "You guys have shown me who God really is, what a healthy relationship looks like, and how to be a loving parent." Another past resident sent us a "happy anniversary of knowing each other" message on the one-year date of when she first moved in, saying she loves us and can't wait for our next visit. One of our current residents celebrated with cake and singing on her two-year sobriety birthday, saying we made her feel like crying tears of gratitude.

Discipleship is our calling and we are looking forward to another year of pouring our hearts out to show God's love to those He sends us. As a team, we are making plans to begin a staff recruiting campaign within Youth With A Mission (our parent organization).

We are also very excited to continue refreshing our 32-year-old home. Our home has been a sanctuary to roughly 600 women, so it's natural that our bathrooms, flooring, kitchen, storage, and decking are in need of some TLC. Steph also has a vision to build a new addition for a maternity boutique for our mommas to "shop." We are making plans for fundraising to see these updates made possible. We want each woman who walks through our doors to continue feeling at home and surrounded by God's love.

NBHomes volunteers are like angels sent by God. New Horizon Church has produced a couple amazing angels who have helped with Spanish translation and vehicle repairs! We are hopeful to add more volunteers who could transport mommas to doctors appointments, shopping errands, or by coming over to prepare a home cooked dinner occasionally. We are so happy to report that our marriage is stronger than ever and our toddler is totally thriving! Personally, our deepened dependence on the Lord has been so significant. Our prayer lives are active and conversational, scripture is speaking profoundly to us, and our times of worship and teaching in church are filling our hearts to keep us able to operate out of the *overflow*! We couldn't be more grateful to every single person who prays and financially supports our family to be fulltime missionaries right here in the Puget Sound.

World Outreach Ministry Foundation was founded in 1993 by Ron and Shirley DeVore with a vision to serve Uganda and spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ. WOMF's journey began with the goal of establishing a church in Seguku, Uganda to impact communities through ministry outreach. Today, WOMF has expanded its reach to eight African countries, positively influencing countless lives. In Uganda, where WOMF originated, considerable progress has been made since the inception of Seguku Worship Center. Pastor Steven Mayanja, co-founder of WOMF, was called by the Lord to bring the Gospel to his nation in his early adult years. Supported by Ron and Shirley DeVore, Pastor Steve pursued his mission of spreading the Gospel. Together, they initiated building Seguku Worship Center to reach Pastor Steve's village, leading to a profound impact on neighboring regions and beyond. Though World Outreach Ministry Foundation has been faced with challenges and difficult transitions after the tragic car accident in 2016, the focus has remained the same. WOMF is dedicated to spreading the Gospel through solid Biblical teachings and evangelistic efforts. WOMF focuses on transforming lives, leadership development, and establishing churches to promote God's message. By identifying the key needs of communities and collaborating with local leaders, WOMF works towards driving positive change and building resilient, thriving communities. WOMF advocates strongly for education to break the cycle of poverty and empower individuals to create a brighter future for themselves and their communities. Through investing in education, WOMF is devoted to the future of its leaders, recognizing that educated individuals can make significant

ast week Don and I had the privilege of Zooming in for the dedication of the first Hands on Houses house with our new partner in Nagaland, Aniu.

Potsole, the widow, was honored with a bouquet and a special shawl. The oldest man in the village shuffled forward to cut the ribbon. Potsole was in tears thanking God for her home! Don prayed a blessing over her. It was a very moving experience. How privileged we are to be able to provide homes for these very poor widows!

We are now building in India, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Nagaland, Zambia, and soon in Eswatini. We are about to start in El Salvador and will build some more houses in Argentina. God keeps opening doors to us!

Don and I gave up our rental home in India at the end of October 2023. We have moved to Florida where we have been able to purchase a home! It is a God story of how faithful friends came alongside of us and enabled us to buy this lovely home

without a mortgage! We have not had our own home since leaving South Africa 25 years ago! How grateful we are to have a place to call *home*!

Florida is very central for us to travel to the different places where Hands on Houses is building. We will be visiting Zambia and El Salvador this year. Our son, Andy, who is part of the Hands on House team, is planning a trip to visit our partners in Nepal and Nagaland toward the end of 2024.

We have now built 409 houses. The goal for 2024 is 100 houses for widows, disabled and the very poor.

We are grateful to our friends at New Horizon Church for your love, support, and prayers!

#### MINISTRY PRAISE REPORT

In October of 2023 we celebrated our church's 10 year anniversary by doing multiple outreaches. Here are some of the highlights:

- -Scores of people came to the Lord, were baptized and are undergoing discipleship.
- -Wedded three couples; these three families are serving the Lord in the church.
- -The Government has approved and certified the new permanent church building; we are now ready to start construction.
- -Miracles of healing among our leaders.
  One of our pastors fell ill and had
  emergency surgery. Doctors thought it was
  cancer. Several exams ruled that out, and
  right now, Pastor Deo is recovering well.
  We bless the Lord.

#### COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM

We are set to graduate 24 trainees out of all our Shilling Programs. We were able to renew our government training license through 2028; an indication that we are doing a commendable job impacting the community.

Since the pandemic, we are receiving many young girls who dropped out of formal school and are now enrolling to acquire a skill. This is not the best choice but probably the only available one.

We realize that these women need more than just a skill, and we emphasize the need to stay in the church to be discipled and supported with their survival - through other life skills.

Several of the women that have gone through the empowerment program have acquired either a sewing machine or hair dryer through a savings program we encourage them to utilize. Others have had well wishers donate these items to them. With that item one is able to start on a journey to self-sustainance through a small business. Enrollment for a new batch of trainees is ongoing.

#### SOCCER ACADEMY

The soccer academy has registered 64 boys and two girls. We feed and take care of 42 of these boys here at the church and empowerment complex during school breaks. Some of the boys who were Muslim gave their lives to the Lord. We have devotions with them and read the word of God to them. It's wonderful to witness their lives change for the better.

Several of the children in our soccer academy program took national exams last year, and several of them passed with high marks and have all been enrolled into schools that have awarded them soccer scholarships.

On the whole, we thank God for His unfailing love over us, for protection and provision to the ministry.

Also, we thank God for the great team of leaders He has brought to us to carry out this vision....and for partnerships like we have with New Horizon, who pray and support us to do the work.

### THE JEFFRIES

SEGUKU, UGANDA

We are the Jeffries Family, and it has been a year since you sent us out as *your* missionaries to Uganda. We hit the ground running, starting off by doing some maintenance projects around the Mission House while we settled in. Then we welcomed our first teams and got to participate in the ministry that the teams were doing. Patti started preaching with Seguku Worship Centre as part of the Evangelism team and Spencer has headed back to the U.S. to fundraise and work. We couldn't have done any of it without such an amazing church sending us on our way. Here are a few recent highlights and what we are hoping for going forward.





With Spencer traveling back to the U.S., we have been focusing on creating a routine in Uganda. Patti homeschools the kids between 8am-2pm. At the same time, Patti attends to the needs of the house Mission House and guest accommodations. Two or three times a week, Patti ministers in local schools. She encourages the students that God made them for a purpose, and He wants a relationship with them. Patti is currently learning Lugandan. Her favorite phrase is "Olimba, Satan," which means "Devil you are lying." One Sunday a month, Patti teaches the teens class at Seguku Worship Centre. On other Sundays, she travels to UCOM churches to speak (Ugandan Christian Outreach Ministries).

Living at the Mission House allows our family to manage the daily tasks of ministry and allows us to spend time with all of its many visitors. We recently hosted "Momma Shirley" (Shirley DeVore)! This was such a highlight, and we thank God for the blessing of having her here for a visit. Our favorite part was watching prominent men melt like young boys seeing their "momma" or "grandma." It's clear to see that she is so special to them. We hope to do many things while we are here in Uganda, and making "Momma Shirley" proud is high on the list.





In the coming months, we will be visiting many more churches and are always happy to do that. At this point (Feb 2024) we have four main areas of focus; management and oversight of the Mission House and teams, the development and starting of a trade school at our Bible College, encouraging and uplifting churches through Sunday visits, and the newest area, which is still in the discovery phase, counseling and encouraging adults and youth through prison ministry.

A big desire for our family is to go to Kenya in November of 2024 to be with a team made up of Patti's family. They will be doing a two-day medical outreach as well as getting some time with family. This is still in the planning phase and needs a lot of support so please be believing with us.

As a family, we are still believing for a vehicle. Traveling to churches and weekly ministry is possible only with a driver. We are hoping for more freedom to move about without hiring a driver and using Mission House vehicles, as this is only possible when they are not being used for teams. There are so many projects in WOMF that need special attention and we would love to highlight these with our travels to them. Usuk is a six-hour drive away and our favorite WOMF project. Lastly, we are planning to return to the States in December 2024 to provide updates on our mission work and to see all of you in person. Until that day, we covet your prayers and are so blessed to be a part of New Horizon Missions.

NHM sent Ron and Shirley DeVore in 1986 to start a new ministry called World Outreach Ministry Foundation. WOMF has since grown into hundreds of churches, many schools, and orphanages. The new Bible School is nearly complete.

### Seguku, Uganda

Patti and Spencer Jeffries were sent out from New Horizon Church as full time missionaries. They support the Mission House by hosting teams that come to serve short term. They also support, teach and care for local pastors and ministries.

### **Fhaton**, Thailand

NHM helped launch Faith Village, an orphanage for the boy soldiers in the early 1990's. Faith Village continues to be a thriving ministry in the midst of a deeply Buddhist community.

### Wakiso, Uganda

NHM has worked in partnership with Wakiso Worship Centre and their Ghetto ministry. This ministry focuses on teens dealing with drug addiction and homelessness.

#### **Food Bank**

Our prayer and prophetic teams are active at each of these events, interacting with scores of guests. Outreach to our community is imperative, as we work diligently to break down the walls that so easily constrain the presence of God. ### Adult & Teen Challenge

The Graham Women's Campus is a local campus of Pacific Northwest Adult & Teen Challenge, a long-term residential recovery and discipleship program for people suffering from drug and alcohol addiction.
