HOPE IN THE MIDST OF WAR

After the full-scale invasion on February 24, 2022, we opened a prayer room which has become the central gathering point for our community. We knew that if we came to Jesus, bringing him ourselves as an offering, he would do what we are not able to. Since then, our community has been circling around the presence of God, merging missions and prayer into a single expression.

When the war began, we jumped into crisis response, helping with evacuations, aid distribution, and

supporting people who lost their homes. We helped build modular houses in time so people would not have to live in their cars during the brunt of winter. We also traveled to minister in the frontline zones of conflict, where amid this devastation and struggle, we saw the first ripple effects of God's Spirit pouring out. The hunger for God we saw is unlike anything we've witnessed in this country before. Churches that were emptied by evacuations at the onset of the war have now been filled with new believers. Churches once emptied are now filled with new believers, many who first came seeking food and aid amid artillery fire.

"I remember standing in front of a church that had just opened its second location. The air rumbled as missiles hit nearby neighborhoods. I preached the Gospel as smoke billowed in the distance through the window. Everyone remained and quietly listened. At the end of the message, we prayed for the sick and urged people to come to Christ. Not only were people healed of bodily pain on the spot, but when they heard the invitation to repent and come home, they turned to Jesus right there in the middle of an active war zone." - Dennis Melnichuk

DENNIS & ANYA MELNICHUK

Dennis and Anya are missionaries in Ukraine carrying a vision for an emerging missions movement that will reach the unreached peoples of the world with the Gospel of Jesus. They lead Awakened Generation and have extensively ministered in the USA and internationally, preaching, training, and organizing mission efforts to fulfill the Great Commission by raising up sons and daughters of God to walk in intimacy with Jesus and reveal the Holy Spirit's power.



THE PULSE ON THE GROUND IN UKRAINE

The whole country is heading toward a critical long-term situation. Families have been torn apart, many of the population having been dispersed as refugees, including many of the younger generation, leaving the country's innovative capacity limping in the workforce. Tens of thousands of men have been drafted into war while civilians live in constant danger of death. Funerals are commonplace, spreading cemeteries with photographs of faces that would have had so much more life ahead of them. With the constantly changing news cycle, many have stopped looking forward to the end of the war.



SURRENDERED SOLDIERS

Soldiers from other countries traveling to the front lines often stop in Ternopil for briefings and paperwork. Partnering with a local church, we gather them for a short worship service and share the Gospel with urgency, knowing it may be their last opportunity to hear it. Almost every time we invite them to receive Christ, every hand is raised. We remain to pray and prophesy, until we know that they have experienced and understood what it means to surrender to King Jesus.



DOORS OF HOPE

There is an unprecedented hunger for evangelism. Street outreach has become a regular rhythm of our community, with a clear focus on discipleship. To bring evangelism and discipleship together, we opened a coffee house in the city center called “Kultura,” which means culture. It has become a natural gathering place where people connect over coffee, while just on the other side of the wall, a doorway leads into the prayer room. Throughout the week, people step through that space to seek God, as prayer and everyday life meet in one place.



FAITHFULNESS BEARING FRUIT

We follow up with those we meet on the streets through events and a weekly Bible study called “Bible Study for the Non-Religious.” We invite people who prefer not to attend church, giving them an opportunity to discover what the Bible really says and is all about.

As we have spent time in intimacy with the Lord, been faithful to discipling those he brings to us, and helped in times of need, he has begun to open the doors to ministry even more widely. We now help coordinate national evangelism events and serve in a nationwide evangelistic alliance.

SONS & DAUGHTERS

There is an emerging generation of young leaders who will be responsible for taking this nation from the ruins of war to the purposes of God. Many have discovered new life in Christ, but the cry for discipleship remains loud. We have met many at events and conferences who desire deeper maturity and wholeness, eager to step into their God-given potential.

In response, we launched a week-long discipleship intensive called the School of Sons and Daughters. The results of this program were phenomenal. People encountered the father heart of God for the first time and discovered a life free from shame and condemnation.

They learned about the purity of the Gospel and what it means to be free and holy through grace. In partnership with others, we have also begun hosting inner healing seminars and are training individuals to help lead others into healing and restoration.



RESPONDING TO THE HUNGER

Dennis and Anya continue to contend for revival in the nation. The need they see is being powerfully met by the Holy Spirit, who is drawing near. As hunger for the Lord increases, their team remains committed to offering mentorship, organizing conferences and training events, mobilizing believers, and caring for the orphan.

One of their most meaningful ministries has been prayer marathons in partnership with other churches. This shared posture of reliance on the Lord, in unity with the wider body of Christ, has already borne powerful testimony across the nation. As they look ahead, Dennis and Anya believe an even greater work of God is still to come in 2026.

Early in our ministry, we developed a deep passion for caring for God's children. Recognizing that God reveals Himself as the "Father of the fatherless" and "defender of the widow," this has become the core focus of our work with orphaned youth, especially teenagers aging out of orphanages.

By simply being present in moments of hardship and need, we have witnessed meaningful encounters with God's love over the years. Our team visits the dormitories where many of these teens live, inviting them to join us for clubs at our missions base where they can escape their usual environment and experience love and acceptance. What often begins with hesitation soon gives way as walls come down and hearts open. For some, it is the first time an adult has shown genuine care. Our hope is to offer alternative housing options this year, providing these young people with a safe place to learn life skills and succeed. Along the way, they can discover how a relationship with God can profoundly transform their lives.

The Divine Hope Story

Divine Hope is serving communities in one of the most underserved regions along the Uganda–Tanzania border. What began as a mission to share the Word of God has grown into a multi-sector outreach meeting real, daily needs. Through healthcare, education, and community development, they are seeing transformation not only physically, but spiritually. Families who once lacked access to basic services are now experiencing stability, dignity, and hope. One of the most visible changes has been in mindset. Parents are beginning to value education, children are learning to read and write, and communities are turning toward healthier practices and faith in God.

Healthcare

The rural maternity center provides prenatal care, safe deliveries, immunizations, and outreach health education, helping reduce reliance on unsafe traditional practices.

Education

The school is reaching children from vulnerable backgrounds, including orphans, and is helping raise a new generation that values learning, faith, and personal growth.

Women Empowerment

Women are being trained in income-generating skills and given opportunities to continue their education, helping them support their families and build a future.

Agriculture

Families are learning sustainable farming methods, leading to increased food security in a region once known for scarcity.

Water

Access to clean water has replaced unsafe shared water sources and transformed daily life, improving health and reducing disease in the community.

HANDS ON *Houses*

One of the greatest accomplishments is seeing the joy on the face of a widow who sees her IMPOSSIBLE dream becoming true and the gratitude to God as words of thanks tumble out of her mouth.



In many parts of the world, losing a husband can mean losing everything. For widows in India, it often brings the loss of income, stability, and even community support. Many are left to care for their children alone, without a safe place to live. Some sleep outdoors, while others try to survive in fragile shelters that leak, invite illness, and offer little protection. Over time, the daily fight to survive can begin to take something deeper: hope.

Hands On Houses exists to meet this need in a tangible way. This small nonprofit partners with local leaders, builders, and volunteers around the world to provide safe, lasting homes for widows, the disabled, and families living in extreme poverty. By working within each community and training local builders, they are not only constructing homes but also creating opportunity, dignity, and sustainability.

The goal of the gift of a Hands on Houses house is to demonstrate the great love of our God to those who receive the house as well as the community they live in. The workers spend time witnessing to the villagers and neighbors and give them the gospel while building the house.

Since May 2025, 56 homes have been built. The impact continues to grow, with new partnerships forming in Zambia, Nepal, and the Philippines, and churches being strengthened.

The transformation is immediate and deeply personal. One of greatest accomplishments is seeing the JOY on the face of a widow who sees her IMPOSSIBLE DREAM becoming true and the gratitude to God as words of thanks tumble out of her mouth.

Looking ahead, Hands On Houses is continuing to pursue a bold goal: building 100 homes in 2026. While this goal has been challenging in past years due to limited funding, the vision remains strong as they pray, fundraise, and seek new partnerships with wisdom and care.

Faith Village

Faith Village is a safe haven for boys and girls to live peacefully as a home sweet home, to learn life skills, achieve Christian education, and to build faith and hope in Christ. A place to learn and become future leaders with integrity.

Since returning to Faith Village Thailand in 2023, the churches have remained strong, gathering weekly and continuing to grow. Believers are being strengthened in the Word, with new members, both young and old, joining each month. Many come from surrounding villages, including children and migrant workers passing through the area.

Ministry across the district has been unified and active, reaching a population of more than 45,000 through sports outreach, worship and music training, and ongoing discipleship efforts. While some ministries have since relocated and are now thriving in new areas, the work continues to expand.

Today, the impact reaches across five locations in northern Thailand, including Chiang Mai, Ban Ma Pha, Mae Chan, Chai Prakarn, and Tha Ton. Each location is seeing steady growth, with a strong focus on reaching both local communities and the next generation.

At Faith Village, children are not only learning about the Lord, academics, and English through Victory Christian Life School, but they are also gaining practical life skills, job training, and business experience. Students receive hands-on training in areas such as auto mechanics, farming, and the school's coffee shop. This year, the community worked together to plant red beans across eight acres while also learning valuable farming and equipment repair skills through hands-on experience.

Victory Church Tha Ton continues to actively reach the Shan community in northern Thailand. Once considered illegal migrants, many Shan people are now a vital part of Thailand's workforce, with more than two million living and working in the country. This has created a significant opportunity to share the Gospel.

Victory Church serves as a place of refuge, growth, and training. New believers are discipled and equipped to serve, with outreach happening in migrant camps and workplaces through visits, food, gifts, and medical supplies. Children are invited each week to be part of church activities, giving them the opportunity to hear the good news of Jesus.



After hearing the Word, a young girl named Sandy gave her life to Jesus. At just six years old, she had been living in a Shan labor camp with her mother and siblings, with no access to school and little stability. Her mother reached out, hoping to give Sandy a safer future at Faith Village and protect her from the risk of human trafficking. When the opportunity came, Sandy eagerly said yes. Sandy is safe, learning, and a joy to everyone at Faith Village.





CHIANG MAI, THAILAND

VICTORY CHURCH

Shan & Lindsey Mahawon

Our desire is to see Jesus-followers in Thailand grow well beyond the mere 1% Christian that exists now. We believe the key to Thailand being truly reached is for its local people to rise up and be all that God has called them to be! Our part in the expansion of God's Kingdom in Thailand is to develop leaders through the local church to reach their own for Christ.

Over four years ago, we planted a church called Victory Church in the strategic location of Chiang Mai: a hub of universities, a booming tourist industry, and headquarters for many local ministries and missionaries. Our church quickly became the fastest growing church of the north. Now, we have nearly 300 adults and 50 kids join each Sunday. We have a thriving volunteer team made up of around 100 people, and a culture that empowers youth by giving opportunities to serve God in many areas of our church.

Our children's and youth program is a strong draw for families, but it also serves as an evangelistic tool. When a young person comes to our church and chooses to follow Jesus, they often come from an unbelieving family. We have seen unbelieving families go from reluctant drivers dropping off their child to supportive participants in church, standing beside their child as they get baptized!



In Thai culture, baptism is a very significant step of faith. They are declaring publicly that they are no longer Buddhist or "trying out" Christianity, but making a bold decision to live their life for one God and one God only. This past year, 26 individuals made the decision to get baptized at Victory Church!

LEADERSHIP SCHOOL

One of the most effective ways we have seen people go from hesitant church-goers to bold leaders is through our annual leadership school. Every year we run a three-month school, teaching Biblical foundations and principles of leadership from the Bible. 28 students graduated from the school this round, 8 of them from other cities. Testimonies from the students revealed how transformative it was to their thinking, empowering them to be better leaders in church, school, and at home. In our own church, we see the fruit as these students begin life groups, invite people to church, and boldly share their faith with others. We have already begun our leadership school for 2026 and have 25 students attending! Some of the students have been church attendees for a long time, and are already feeling challenged to go beyond church attendance and step into what God is calling them to do.

OUTREACH

This past year, we had the privilege of sending one of our church members as a missionary to an unreached Muslim area of Thailand, where God is already using her relationships to bring people to Christ. In July, we hosted another outreach event at a local mall, showing an episode of “The Chosen” and sharing the Gospel with a packed theater of more than 300 people despite several challenges along the way. We also launched a growing Saturday night service that is reaching workers and young people, while life groups continue to expand throughout the church, with 10 active groups now creating spaces for discipleship, community, and spiritual growth. As we look ahead to 2026, we remain committed to equipping people to boldly share Jesus and love the city of Chiang Mai well.





WORLD OUTREACH MINISTRY FOUNDATION

World Outreach Ministry Foundation (WOMF) exists to train, equip, and support local leaders who are bringing transformation to their own nations. Their heart is to see people across Africa live fully, with communities strengthened through the power and love of Christ.

Founded in 1993 by Ron and Shirley DeVore after years of ministry in Uganda, WOMF now serves across eight African countries through a growing network of leaders.

Their work focuses on holistic transformation through ministry outreach, education, care for vulnerable children, women's empowerment, and sustainable solutions like health and clean water, all with the goal of sharing Christ's love in both word and action.

The New Horizon team visited a community in northeastern Uganda, in the Karamojong region, in Rupa village. They discovered a church gathering under a temporary shelter—roofing sheets placed atop metal poles, with only a dirt floor beneath them. In partnership with local masons, New Horizon has been instrumental in laying a concrete floor, providing the congregation with a more secure and dignified space to gather and worship. This approach helped build trust and encouraged everyone to take ownership of the transformation. It also created opportunities to spread the Word of God to unreached people in the community. The school children got to witness what Jesus can do through His people. The Gospel is advancing in this village.



Kigangazi Worship Centre is a community church where both the pastor and his congregation made a concerted effort to build a permanent place of worship. They made bricks and contributed funds to begin construction of a permanent church structure where they could gather. Their efforts resulted in a brick structure raised to the wall-plate level. However, they lacked the funds to complete the roof, and construction stalled for several years. After much prayer and believing God to fulfill His work, a miracle happened. The long-awaited prayer was answered through New Horizon Church providing the funds needed to roof Kigangazi Worship Centre. This demonstrated firsthand the power of prayer and the faithfulness of waiting on God.



Equipping local pastors is key to lasting ministry and spiritual growth. Pastor Dwain Wolfe has played a vital role in training and strengthening leaders through World Outreach Ministry Foundation, helping them grow in faith and lead with clarity and conviction. At the National Leaders Summit 2025 and the Pastors and Leaders Conference, Pastor Dwain and Pastor Joe Sims ministered to more than 300 leaders from multiple nations, teaching on faith, prayer, and the power of confession. Over several days, pastors were equipped, renewed, and sent back with fresh boldness to lead and serve their communities.

The Soulieres

PUYALLUP → TEXAS → SALEM, OREGON

We are the Souliere family: Jon, Steph, and Areli (age 5), and we are thrilled to be entering our FOURTH year of house-parenting in maternity homes. As a family, we are called not just to walk alongside women experiencing unplanned pregnancy, but to LIVE with them. Our homes have offered sanctuary to 34 women over the last several years, and we are blessed to begin a brand new chapter of hope in 2026!

Most recently, we were serving in East Texas at Fatherheart Maternity Home. There, we saw some incredible transformations in the lives of our pregnant residents and their children. One young woman was baptized the same week the Lord reunited her with her first child after about six months apart. This mama, who chose LIFE for her second baby, has become a dearly loved woman of God right before our eyes. She is still growing in her parenting skills and laying a foundation for her family by working hard and teaching her children about Jesus.

Did you know that the most at-risk pregnancies for abortion in our nation today are second and third babies? It's true. Studies are showing that these mothers are already overwhelmed, exhausted, and barely making ends meet. Adding another child to the chaos feels impossible. But this is where the church has an opportunity to rise up and encourage LIFE as a supportive community. My prayer is that you'll notice a single mama and connect with her. Get to know her. Spend time with her and her children. She needs you.

This brings us to our very exciting news. Jesus, in all His wisdom and kindness, has paved a way for our family to return to the beautiful Pacific Northwest. We have been more than a little homesick, so we feel especially blessed to be relocating just a three-hour drive from family to Salem, OR.

Road to Hope Maternity Home has been serving pregnant women in the Portland area for 27 years, and the need in the region is great. In response to this need for more housing and more of Jesus, Road to Hope asked our family to help establish a second maternity home campus in Salem, where we will serve as house parents. The location is currently undergoing renovations to welcome up to five pregnant women and any children already in their care. This is new ground for us. To offer hope to a single mom already overwhelmed and needing a lifeline is such a privilege. Please be praying for the construction process, occupancy permits, provision of materials, and for the local community to come alongside us in furnishing a beautiful home. We are aiming for a ribbon-cutting ceremony on September 1.



We have some important prayer requests and needs for this endeavor. First, our family is establishing a sense of home in a new city, so we ask for prayer as we settle in and build community. Our sweet son is 5 years old, and while his childhood is thriving and joy-filled, it is definitely different from the norm. We ask for grace in his heart during this transition and for wisdom as we raise him to know that Jesus is Lord.

The Road to Hope ministry team is welcoming us so well and is such a blessing to be part of. We have been going through training and have noticed a deep sense of God's love running through every aspect of leadership and their foundational values. Please pray for us to build strong bonds and a deep sense of unity within our team.

Our first residents could be pregnant even now, so please be praying for them. Pray for her to choose LIFE and to find Road to Hope. We will be ready to love her, guide her, and show her Jesus.

Our passion is to create a home built on the foundation of Jesus that welcomes all who enter and leads toward real hope and healing. As we build a program and develop a pro-life network of services in the Salem area, please partner with us through prayer, volunteering, and financial support. You make it possible for our family to devote our time, skills, and talents to answering God's call.

Thank you to New Horizon Church, our home base and church family. We had an amazing month reconnecting with you in February before moving to Salem. We look ahead with more experience and cannot wait to witness Him move in beautiful ways.





L.A. Dream Center

NEW HORIZON SHORT TERM MISSIONS

June 2025

Last June, this incredible team stepped out to serve the homeless and reach those in need across Los Angeles. It became a life-changing experience for every member. The Los Angeles Dream Center operates around the clock, meeting the needs of some of the most marginalized communities in the city.

We spent five days on the ground, with each day focused on different outreach efforts, morning and afternoon. The pace of ministry never slowed. One morning, we walked through Skid Row, distributing food and praying for countless individuals. At times, the conditions were overwhelming, yet it did not stop us from sharing the gospel.

Another afternoon, we served in low-income housing projects. On a different day, we worked in the kitchen, helping prepare meals for hundreds of staff members and ministry teams.

Evenings were set aside for worship and reflection, creating space to process all we had seen and experienced. This trip strengthened each person's calling to live as Christ in every moment of daily life.

We were impressed that everywhere we turned, there were opportunities to pray with people. No matter what our assignment was, there was always someone nearby with a need. It only took one team member to respond to the Holy Spirit and step out in boldness. There were so many incredible testimonies of people ready to give their lives to Christ. Often, it simply started with asking to pray for an obvious need. Leading them to Christ was so simple. Jesus truly walked the streets with us everywhere we went.

One highlight was stopping at a spot overlooking the entire area. We arrived just as a gentleman began to pour oil over the edge and pray. We joined him as he interceded for the region. God’s timing is truly amazing.

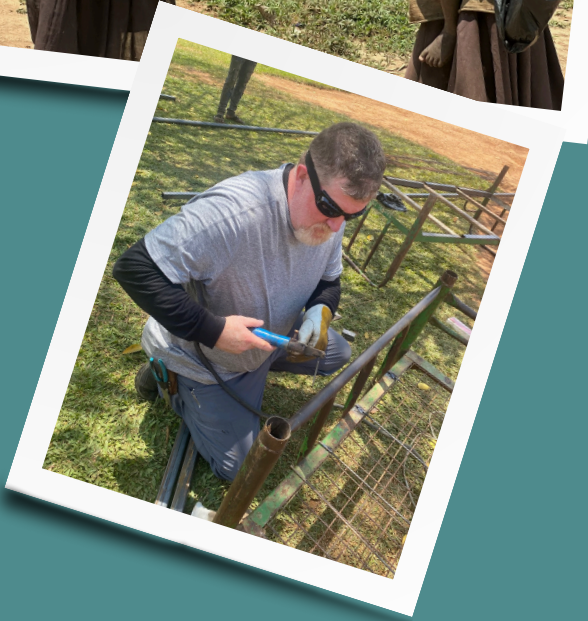
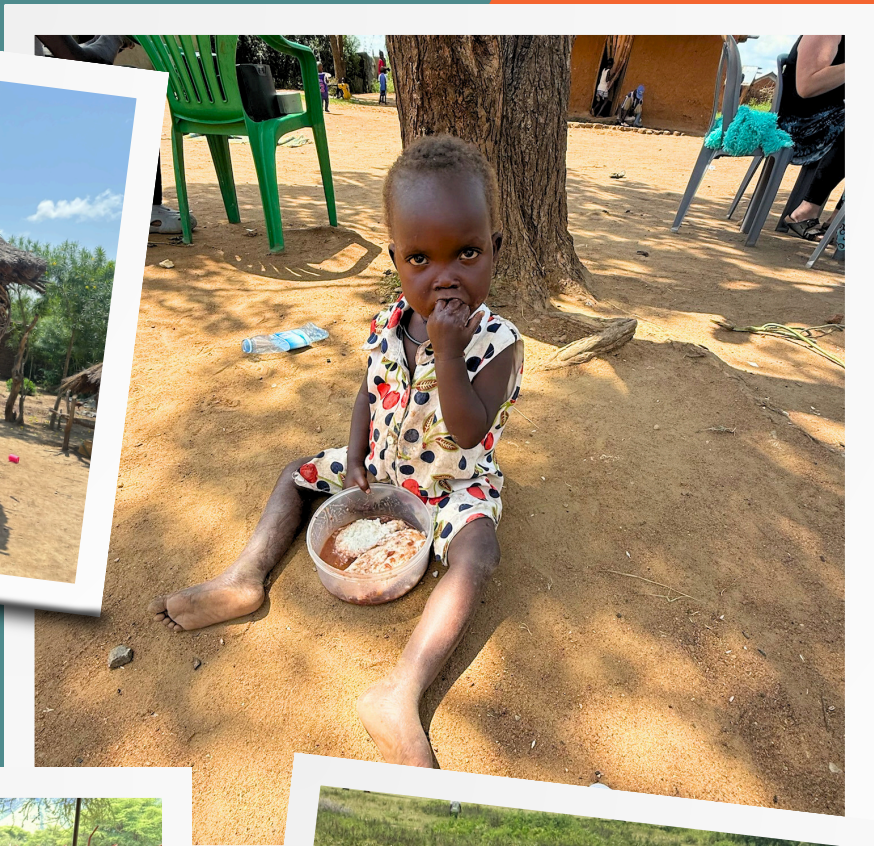
The September 2025 Uganda missions trip was one for the books. Uganda is a nation filled with beautiful people and great spiritual need.

The NHC team split into two groups. One group taught daily at the international pastors' conference. They experienced God move in each session as the pastors heard life-giving messages. The other half of the team traveled north into Karamoja to do ministry, including multiple feeding programs and a shoe giveaway, all while sharing the gospel and praying with everyone who would allow us to.

So much was accomplished in our short time there, and we are expectant for all God will continue to do.

My360 project is an organization that is impactful on many levels. The end goal is to put “growable” shoes and socks on as many children around the world as possible. Before any shoes are given away, My360 locally sources all materials and hires local workers to make them. This ministry model infuses the local areas with economic strength and supports multiple families in the process.

When teams arrive, they sit with children one-on-one to wash their feet and care for any wounds while sharing the love of Jesus with each child. It is truly a humbling and moving experience. The joy on the faces of children as they walk away with clean socks and a pair of shoes that will grow with them, up to three sizes, is unforgettable.



LOCAL MISSIONS

LOVING FIFE AND BEYOND

At New Horizon Church, our heart has always been to see lives transformed by the power of Jesus, both across the world and right here at home. The same gospel that is reaching the nations is alive and active in our own city. This is what local missions looks like for us: bringing the love of Jesus into real places, with real people, in real need.

Our Food Bank continues to grow. Every week, individuals and families are welcomed with dignity, practical support, and prayer offered in English, Spanish, and Ukrainian. For the first time, we served year-round, removing the winter pause and creating a steady place of hope for those who rely on it.

On Saturdays, our outreach teams gather alongside other local churches with a shared purpose: to love, serve, and restore those experiencing homelessness, addiction, trafficking, and deep hardship.



BRINGING THE LOVE OF JESUS INTO REAL PLACES

What has grown is more than a ministry. It is a unified expression of the Church. Together, we have seen lives shift as people step into recovery programs, enter rehabilitation, and move from shelters into stable housing.

This year, we also invested in equipping leaders and volunteers through training with Seattle Union Gospel Mission, strengthening our ability to serve with both compassion and wisdom. At the same time, our sack lunch and shuttle support ministries continued to meet practical needs with consistency and care.

Beyond weekly outreach, we had the opportunity to engage our broader community in meaningful ways. Our largest-ever Back-to-School event served over 800 students and families with backpacks, haircuts, dental services, food, and encouragement. During the holiday season, we provided over 300 Thanksgiving meals to families in the Fife School District and gave more than 300 Christmas gifts to children through our Night of Giving. We also partnered with the City of Fife to host our first Santa Stop and Drop, creating a joyful and memorable experience for local families.



Throughout the year, we ministered to more than 5,200 individuals experiencing homelessness through our outreach programs. Each number represents a person seen, valued, and loved.

During our January Daniel Fast, our church stepped beyond personal sacrifice and into intentional outreach. Through prayer walks, worship in the city, and hands-on serving, we chose to lay down our comfort to love and bless our neighbors in tangible ways.

Looking ahead, we are continuing to build. A new outreach location in Tacoma is in development, creating even more opportunities to reach those who need the hope of Jesus. We are committed to stewarding what God has entrusted to us while believing for greater impact in the days ahead.

We invite you to pray with us for increased resources, expanded access to rehabilitation programs, provision for food and housing, and more people who are willing to step in and serve. Every act of obedience matters. Every life matters. This is our city, and we are committed to seeing it transformed.

CareNet offers hope by providing compassionate practical care, accurate information, biblical truth, and life-affirming resources for pregnancy, sexual health and integrity, and abortion recovery. They are fiercely committed to the value and dignity of every life.

Ninety-seven percent of its pregnant clients who have an ultrasound in CareNet centers choose life for their babies. To the three percent that do not, CareNet offers continued support. They are welcomed back to CareNet centers for additional services and resources anytime they are needed.

Through the power of Jesus, the success rate of Adult and Teen Challenge is unrivaled.
